

## TARDIS Toilet Paper Cover

### Recommended Materials:

60g/120yds Red Heart Super Saver in Royal

2g/4yds Red Heart Super Saver in Black

3g/6yds Red Heart Super Saver in White

5mm crochet hook

1 skein black embroidery floss (optional)

Stitch Marker (optional)

Tapestry/yarn needle

### Key

SS – Slip stitch

Ch# – Chain #

SC – Single crochet

BPSC – Back post single crochet

BPSC Tog – Back Post Single Crochet Together. Single crochet two together, but through the back loops only

Double Magic Circle – Like a Magic Circle, but with two wraps around your finger instead of just one for additional security. I also crochet over the tail to make it even more secure

Surface Crochet – SS across the surface of a piece

## Main Cover

Crocheted in the round, so you continuously crochet and do not close each round at the end

1. With the Royal blue color, Double Magic Circle and put 7 SC into the Magic Circle. Pull on the tail to close the circle and place stitch marker to identify the last stitch of the round if you are using one. Move stitch marker up on each round
2. 2SC in each stitch all the way around
3. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next stitch) 7x
4. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 2 stitches) 7x
5. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 3 stitches) 7x
6. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 4 stitches) 7x
7. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 5 stitches) 7x
8. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 6 stitches) 7x
9. (2SC in the same stitch, SC in the next 7 stitches) 7x, SS to close the round [63 SC total]



10. Ch1, BPSC in every stitch around [63 BPSC total]
11. SC in every stitch around for a total of 17 rounds including the

BPSC round, SS closed at the end

12. Ch1, (BPSC, BPSC2Tog) 21x, SS to close and fasten off

## Black Topper

1. In black, Ch 13
2. In 2<sup>nd</sup> chain from hook, SC in every chain [12 total]
3. Ch1, Sc in every stitch, fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing



## Windows

Make two

1. In white, Ch 6
2. In 2<sup>nd</sup> chain from hook SC in every chain [5 total]
3. Ch1, SC in every stitch across. Repeat this row 4 more times for a total of 5 rows. Fasten off and leave a long tail for sewing



## Assembling

This part requires a little bit of eyeballing. You can use existing stitches as a method of keeping lines straight. Surface crochet moving up will go into every other row since crochet stitches zig zag a bit.

1. With the Royal yarn on your blue cover piece, turn it so that you are seeing the opposite side from where you fastened off and surface crochet straight up from the bottom to the top



2. Sew the black topper to the top of the side of the cover piece covering the initial surface crochet at the top, making sure to keep it even across the top



3. Using the black topper and center surface crochet as a guide, sew on the windows



4. Using the Royal yarn, surface crochet from the bottom to the top on the outside of each window. Use your crochet hook to eyeball so that you can go straight up



5. Optional: Use all 6 strands of embroidery to sew on the black window pane separators. I went down the center of each window and then across the center of each window



6. Weave in all ends
